The candidate **must** have at least a Master's Degree (Ph.D. preferred) in a related field, along with experience teaching French at the college level. Native or near-native competence in French and English are **required**. Evidence of commitment to students' success and recruitment, and of participation in departmental activities is **desirable**.
