The anticipated start date is fall 2022. This is a full-time, 9-month, nontenure track, benefit eligible position with a 4/4 teaching load. Responsibilities for this position include teaching literature courses for English undergraduates, English Education majors, and master's students in the Literature Program. Faculty will teach online courses as well as inperson courses and participate in professional development and service activities of a large and vibrant department.

This academic year appointment starts Fall 2022 and is renewable contingent upon performance, program needs, departmental needs, and university funding.
